## ***MHA Announcements***

Mary Boyer, MHA member, author, and local historian passed away at the age of 87 on December 10, 2022. Ms. Boyer, an active research of Charlotte's local history for 50 years, played a very active role in the

historical restoration of Latta Place, served on the boards of several historical organizations throughout the Charlotte area (including the MHA), and was the author of Charlotte, Postcards from a New South City 1905-1950. Mary was also a contributor to the Charlotte History Roundtable and was always generous in sharing her research findings with other historians.
