June 1st – June 3rd . 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Kings Mountain Historical Museum. “*War & Memory: A Commemoration of Remembrance.*” In-person. Free. (EXHIBIT) This exhibit is an introduction to “Decoration Day” and its roots within the African American Community to honor and remember Union Soldiers after the Civil War, how it evolved during World War I to expand to honor all American war fatalities, becoming a Federal Holiday, and being declared as “Memorial Day” later on after World War II. This exhibit will feature Civil War, WWI and WWII artifacts and ephemera on display in remembrance of residents of Cleveland County in honor of Memorial Day in 2023.

June 1st – March 2024. Charlotte Museum of History. “*Captured in Cartoons! 200 Years of Charlotte’s History as Interpreted in Comics, Caricatures, and Animation.*” In-Person. Cost of admission for general public. Free for members.. Cost of admission. <https://charlottemuseum.org/programs-events/events/exhibit-opening-captured-in-cartoons/> . For hundreds of years, political cartoons have helped Charlotteans understand everything from World Wars to the World Cup. In "Captured in Cartoons," visitors can explore cartoons from throughout Charlotte's history, see original drawings from Pulitzer Prize-winner Kevin Siers, and experiment with making their own cartoons. This official opening event will include a conversation with Kevin Siers, light refreshments, and a brief tour of the exhibit.

June 6th -September 8th . Levine Museum of the New South. “*Climates of Inequality: Stories of Environmental Justice-Climate Refugees in the City of Creeks.*” Cost of admission. An exhibition of multimedia stories from across North and South America, a featured exhibition, "Climate Refugees in the City of Creeks," explores histories of environmental change, displacement, and migration in Charlotte. The

exhibit showcases the voices and artwork of students, teachers, and community members, by highlighting Charlotte's contributions to the environmental justice movement from the first Earth Day in 1970 to today.

McConnells, SC 29726). “*Battle of Huck’s Defeat.*” In-person. \$10 general admission, free for CHM members and ages 3 and under. Go to <https://chmuseums.org/event/hucks/> for additional information. Annual two-day living history reenactment centers on this important battle (Battle of Williamson’s Plantation, aka. Battle of Huck’s Defeat) fought in the South Carolina Backcountry at present-day Historic Brattonsville in York County, SC (McConnells, SC) on July 14, 1780. Two days of family friendly activities featuring 18th century reenactors and camps, cooking demonstrations, musket-firing and cavalry demonstrations, site preservation and battlefield tours, and children’s toys, games, and militia drill. Huck’s Defeat battle reenactment on Saturday/July 15th at 2 p.m. Battle of Stallings’ Plantation reenactment on Sunday/July 16th at 2 p.m.

September 2-3rd. Saturday 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Sunday 11 a.m. – 3 p.m. Historic Rural Hill. “*Battle of Charlotte / Battle of the Bees Revolutionary War Reenactment*”. In-person. Online tickets - \$10 (Saturday OR Sunday only), \$20 (full weekend). On-site tickets - \$15 (Saturday OR Sunday only), \$25 (full weekend). Family-friendly, educational weekend event featuring two Revolutionary War era battle reenactments - Battle of Charlotte (Saturday only at 2 p.m.), Battle of the Bees (Sunday only at 2 p.m.) 18th-century historical camps, cooking, living history demonstrations, talks, programs, and Revolutionary War era military black powder cannon and musket-firing demonstrations.

October 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th. 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Historic Brattonsville. “*Harvest on the Homestead*”. Good old-fashion fall festivities at Historic Brattonsville every Saturday in October. Living history programs at Historic Brattonsville highlight the harvest season on the plantation during the 18th and 19th centuries. Every Saturday in October will feature one of these harvest-time activities: corn shelling, wood rail and shingle-splitting (Oct. 8th), basket weaving, running the cotton gin, natural dyeing techniques for cotton, food preservation and historical cooking demonstrations with dishes celebrating corn, apples, and pumpkins. She will share how secretly 'coded information' provided Freedom Seekers with information about how, when and where to escape. She will also share how our Quaker Abolitionists friends from the North and many from NC provided abundant help, and how other Abolitionists helped Freedom Seekers gain their freedom along with the role 'Black Jacks' (Black Ship Pilots) and others working in the maritime industry passed on vital information to Abolitionists and Freedom Seekers.
