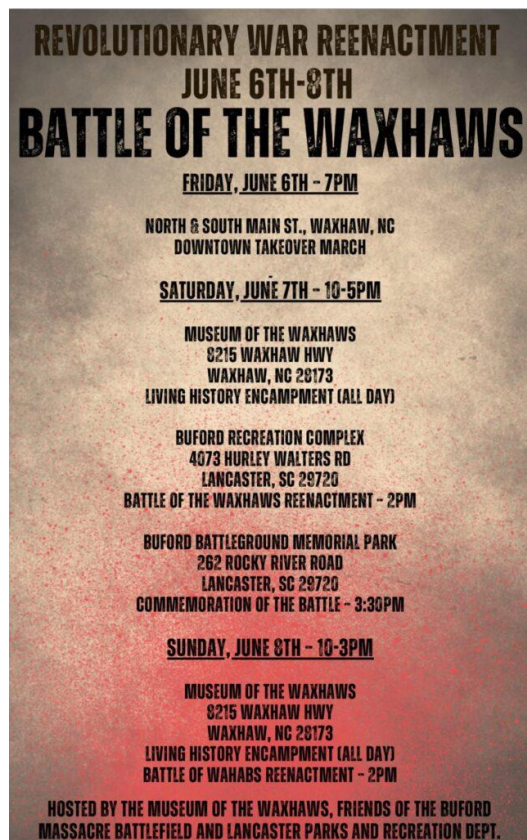

June 21st - Listen & Remember 60th Anniversary Show!



From 1965 to 2006, the town of Waxhaw, NC, was home to a beloved outdoor play called Listen and Remember. The play told the story of the formation of the Waxhaws Colonial Settlement by Scots-Irish immigrants, a pivotal moment in the history of the area, and the birthplace of future U.S. President Andrew Jackson.

Written by local school teacher Dare Steele, Listen and Remember brought to life the struggles and triumphs of the early settlers as they worked to establish a new life in the wilderness. With original music written by Waxhaw native Elinor Niven McLaughlin, the play was a true community effort, presented by the Waxhaws Historical Festival & Drama Association and the Waxhaw Women's Club.
