Colorful Matthews: A Coloring Book

Barbara Taylor, former Director of Matthews Heritage Museum and Barbara Stegall, Matthews Heritage Museum docent, former teacher, and pre-school director have created a delightful coloring book exploring the historic buildings of Matthews.

COLORFUL MATTHEWS features 15 pages of original pen and ink drawings of historic structures that can be colored. The artists are local history enthusiasts, Janet Dyer and Phil Tappy. These pictures are followed by information about each structure. Each page is perforated, and the 8 ½ x 11 format makes it easy to frame.

Among the featured structures are Matthews Heritage Museum, Renfrow's Hardware Store, Matthews Historic Cemetery, and Outen's pottery Kiln. Some of these landmarks are not well known by the local

population, but this coloring book gives children, parents, and grandparents an opportunity to learn about the Matthews community, while they enjoy coloring each historic site. Each building's address is listed, as well as the history and year it was built, and the name of the current business, if appropriate. These books are now on sale for \$10 per copy.
